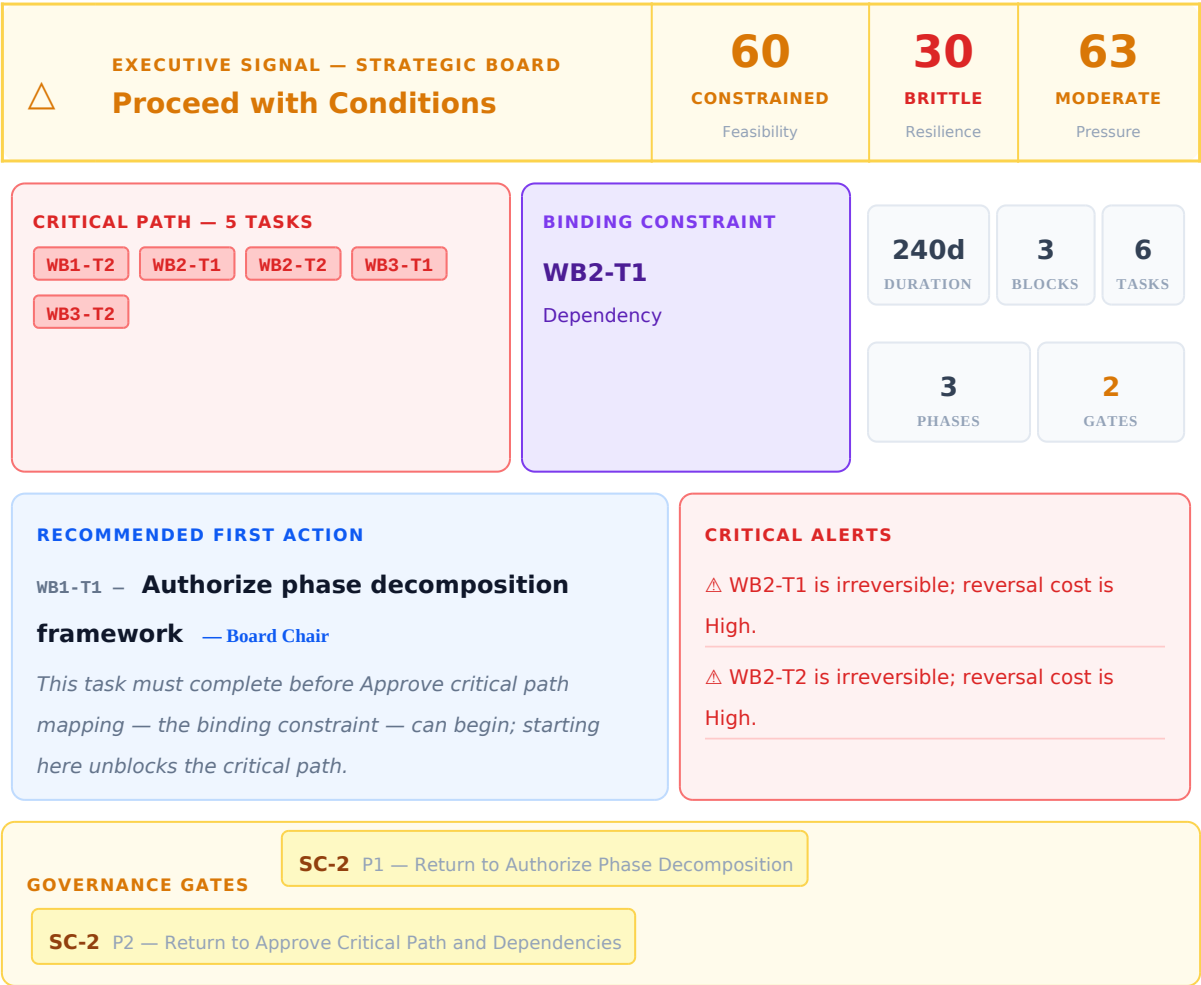

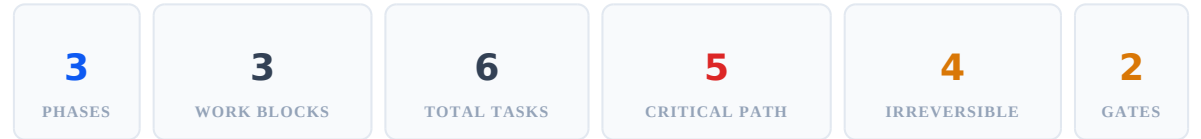

- > Defer implementation prioritization tasks until critical path mapping is ratified.
- > Allocate preparatory resources to support Board decision-making on dependencies.
